- 2) Sail and powerboat social raft-ups starting in April with a general schedule of at least one per month.
- 3) A spring and fall all member trip to Port Royal Landing for a picnic buffet at the Back Porch Grill. This would be a boat to or drive to event.
- 4) Club sponsored sail boat races.



Several of our community minded members suggested that our Yacht Club could use its assets of sail and powerboat owners for a charitable benefit. This idea could benefit the skippers who chose to participate and put the Yacht Club name out into the public arena. Several worthy organizations were discussed and a possible candidate could be Hilton Head Heroes. For those not familiar with this local group, its focus is on helping families that have a seriously ill child in bringing that family to Hilton Head Isl. for a brief respite from the daily battles they must face. A one week vacation is provided with basically all cost, lodging, food, activities being covered by the organization and its sponsors. I think of the times that I have taken friends and their kids out on the boat, and the excitement those kids have in seeing their first dolphin, and osprey overhead or just the natural beauty of our area as seen from the water. Imagine what we could bring to a child and family whose life has been hospitals, treatments and struggles.
