For September the Wine Club is providing two wines that are related, essentially from the same grape even tho one is red while the other is white. I am speaking of Pinot Noir and its' clone from which we get Pinot Gris/Pinot Grigio. Same grape produces both of the clones, it is only the production method which is different. The Italian method produces Pinot Grigio and the French method produces Pinot Gris. The Acrobat 2021 Pinot Gris is our selection for this month. It comes from Oregon's most reputed wine region: the Willamette Valley (pronounced like dam it). Pinot Gris is the second most popular wine in Oregon; Pinot Noir being numero uno! Oregon does both of these wines exceptionally well. Pinot Gris is an excellent and versatile food pairing wine. It will be a perfect choice to accompany our September menus which feature fish, chicken or pork. Sustainable wine making practices are used when crafting this Acrobat wine. It is a medium dry wine, well balanced with low acidity. Wine Enthusiast Magazine gave the 2021 vintage 91 points.

Acrobat '21 Pinot Gris

Oregon: Dayton, Willamette Valley

Color: Pale Straw

Body: Medium

Aroma: Notes of pear, apple, lemon zest and melon.

Taste: Crisp tropical fruit flavors with apple and a touch of spice.

Finish: Bright and refreshing, semi dry



The second wine, a Pinot Noir, is the parent of the clone. This Pinot Noir comes from Italy and the winery that produces it is family owned and was established 65 years ago. Back then the labels were hand written and the bottles were wrapped in straw. In 1971 the winery won their first gold medal. The third generation is now producing the wines and for several years they have been incorporating organic methods. This wine has become one of the more popular IGT wines of the Veneto region. It is an easy drinking wine with bright fruit, low tannins and no oak. A good choice to pair with our September menus featuring Italian sausages, chicken parmigiana, duck or pork.

Italy: Veneto

Color: Garnet to Dark Ruby

Body: Medium

Aroma: Ripe red cherries with hints of orange zest

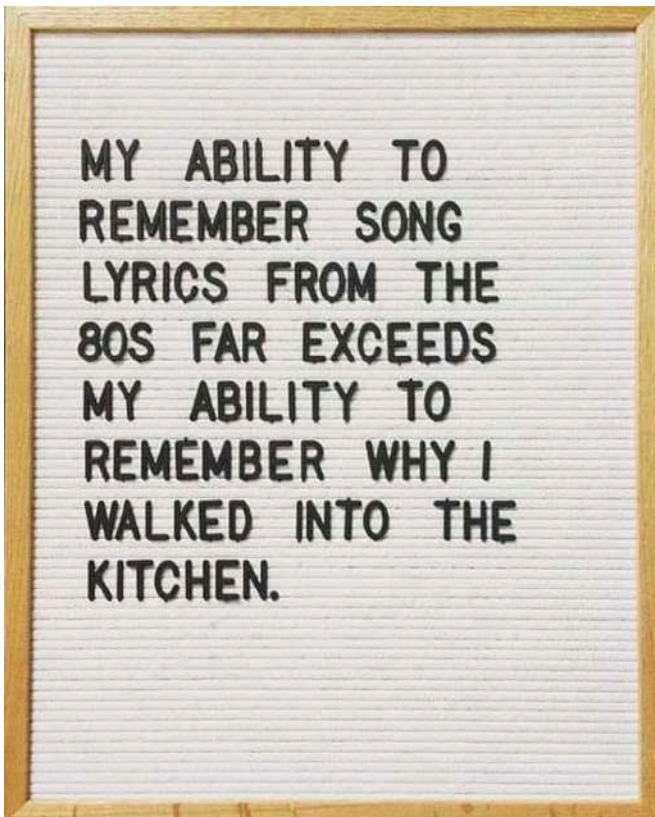
Taste: Cherry, blackberry, pomegranate

Finish: Crisp and long; dry with medium tannins
